- 10 courses (30 credits) are required (as defined below)
- Minimum 6 upper division courses (300 level and above)
- Maximum 6 social science (PPS) courses from distribution requirements may also be used toward the concentration.
- More than one Selected Topics course (ending in “00”) from the same department can be taken if topics are different.

1. Look at your plan. If a requirement has a “DC” (or “XC”) next to it, take a course from that section of the distribution (“smiley face”) list, with a smiley face in the PPS column; Up to 6 appropriate courses can be used for both a distribution requirement (slots 9-16 on program checklist) and this concentration (see overlapping categories in the 2nd column below).
2. The 4 or more courses that will NOT also overlap with distribution requirements do not need to come from the “smiley face” list. Choose courses using the guidelines at the bottom of this page. Be sure to consider prerequisites!
3. Be sure that your 10 planned choices include at least 6 upper division courses (300 level and above).

Guidelines for choosing social science courses not on the distribution lists (for concentration course slots #7-10)

- African American Studies All AAS courses on the Social Science Track list published by the AAS department.
- Anthropology: All ANT courses *except* ANT 131, 431 & 433 and other biological anthropology courses
- Communications (Newhouse) COM 107 (access may be restricted)
- Economics: All ECN courses.
- School of Education: CFE or DSP courses that are cross listed with SOC; EDU 300 section titled Media, Democracy & Social Issues; SPE/RED 400 Literacy, Inclusion & Diversity in Italy (summer/study abroad)
- Geography All GEO courses *except* GEO 155, 215, 316, 317, 318, 319, 326, 327, 381, 383, 386, 455, 482, 555, 583, 595 and other physical geography courses.
- History: All HST courses
- Honors: HNR 260, 360, 460 Honors courses, except for those PSY based – e.g. Human Predicament does not count.
- International Relations All IRP courses
- LGBT Studies QSX 111, QSX/WSP 438, 447 and QSX courses cross-listed in other areas on this PPS list.
- Maxwell MAX 123, 132
- Public Affairs All PAF courses, except for practica and 410 skill-only courses.
- Political Science All PSC courses
- Sociology All SOC courses
- Social Science All SOS courses
- Women’s Studies WGS 201, WGS/CRS 414, and WGS courses cross-listed in other areas on this PPS list.
- Ethnic Studies Areas (e.g., South Asian Studies, Middle Eastern Studies, etc.) – course cross listed under the areas listed above.
