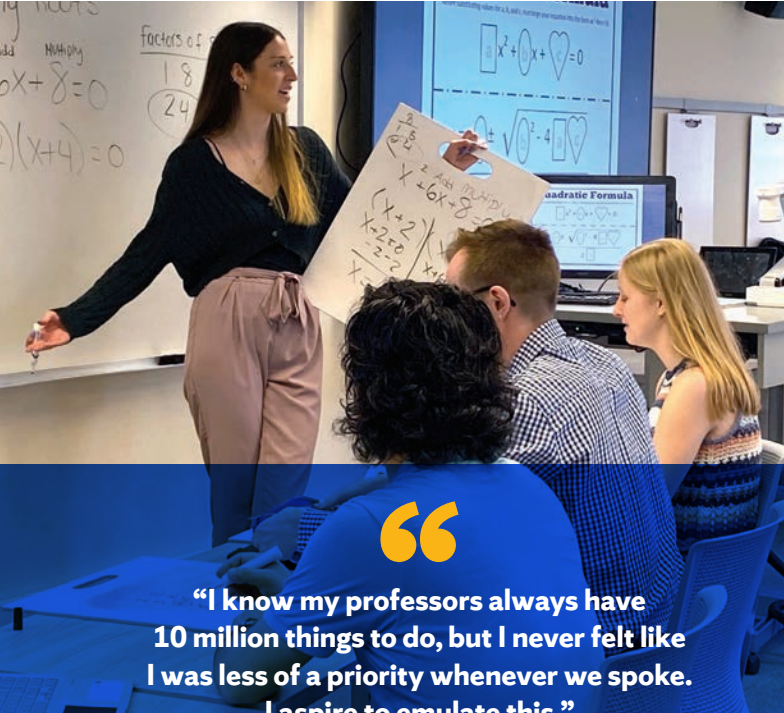

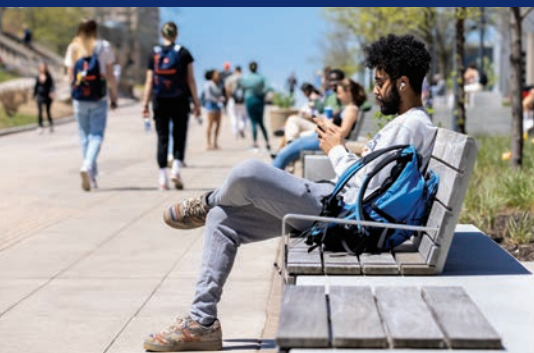


Small Town Feel, Big City Experiences

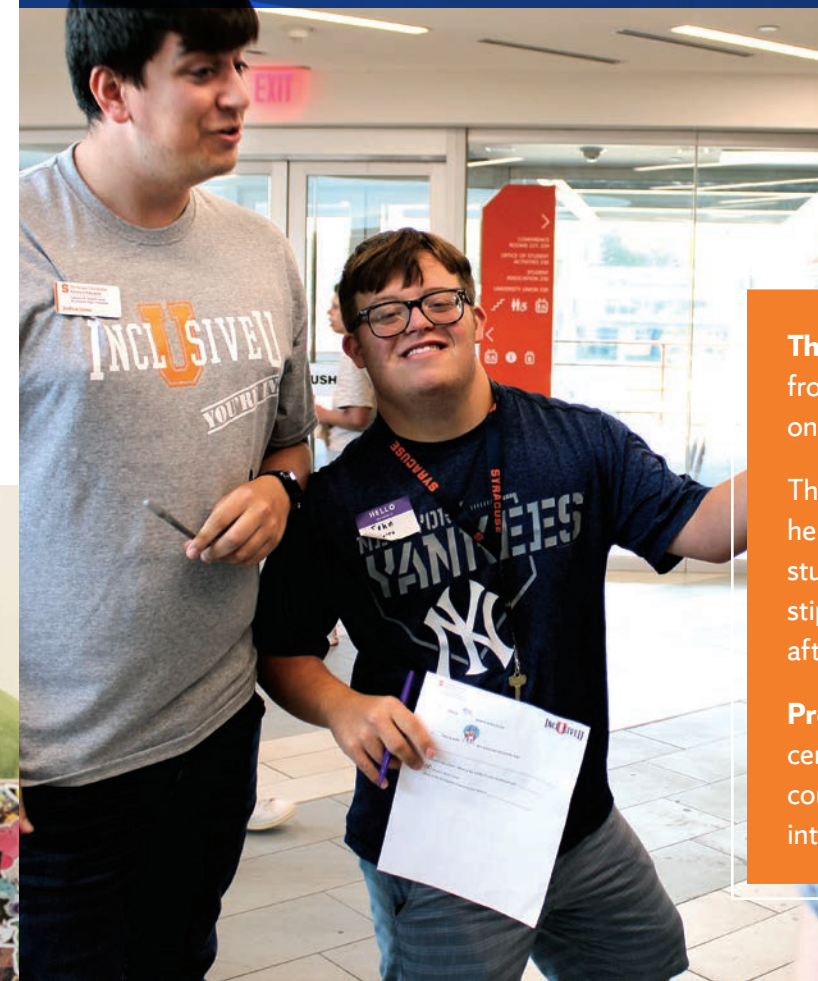

The **School of Education is dedicated** to the idea that teachers from underrepresented backgrounds have an essential impact on young learners.

The **Baldanza Fellows Program for Diverse Teachers** is helping to diversify teachers in Syracuse schools by providing student teachers with full scholarships, cost-of-living stipends, and a hiring commitment (subject to availability) after graduation.

Project IMPRESS aims to recruit, prepare, and retain fully certified, diverse special education teachers and school counselors to work with students with disabilities with high-intensity needs in high-needs schools.
